THE King has been pleased by Letters Patent under the Great Seal to grant to The Right Honourable Sir James Charles Mathew, Knight, late one of the Lords Justices of Appeal, an annuity of £3500.

PRIVY COUNCIL OFFICE, DUBLIN CASTLE, February 7, 1906.

His Majesty, by His Royal Letter, having appointed Sir Francis Edmund Workman Macnaughten, Baronet, to be of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council in Ireland, he this day in Council took the usual oaths and his place at the Board accordingly.

WHITEHALL, February 8, 1906.

The King has been pleased to give and grant unto John Edwin Marshall, Esq., Judge in the Egyptian Native Court of Appeal, His Majesty's Royal licence and authority that he may accept and wear the Insignia of the Third Class of the Imperial Ottoman Order of the Medjidieh, conferred upon him by His Highness the Khedive of Egypt, authorised by His Imperial Majesty the Sultan of Turkey, in recognition of valuable services rendered by him.

WHITEHALL, February 9, 1906.

The King has been pleased to give and grant unto Captain Charles Joel Higgins, Master of the British steamship "Clan Mackay," His Majesty's Royal licence and authority that he may accept and wear the Insignia of Cavalleiro da Ordem da Christo, which Decoration has been conferred upon him by His Majesty the King of Portugal and the Algarves in recognition of his services to the Portuguese transport "Sao Thomé," which vessel foundered in the Red Sea in the year 1904.

## EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1875.
