Copy of a letter from Captain Major JACOB HENNI-KER, of his Majesty's sloop the Albacore, to WILLIAM MARSDEN, Esq. dated the 17th instant.

SIR,

I beg leave to transmit to you, for the information of my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, a copy of my letter to Rear-Admiral Sir James Saumarez, Bart. of this date.

"I find it my duty to acquaint you, that yesterday, the 16th, in proceeding from Granville Bay, in pursuance of your orders, at the distance of three miles, I had an opportunity of observing the five flotilla driven on shore on the 9th ult. the five flotilla driven on thore on the 9th uit.
