THE King has been pleased, by Warrant under His Majesty's Royal Sign Manual, bearing date the 14th instant, to appoint Mr. James Scott to be a Macer in the Court of Session in Scotland, in the room of Mr. William Heron, retired.

WHITEHALL, April 18, 1906.

The King has been pleased to give and grant unto Edward Lambton, Esq., Director of Works in the Egyptian Ministry of Public Works, and Reginald Gower Kirton, Esq., M.D., Principal Medical Officer of the Egyptian Prisons Administration, His Majesty's Royal licence and authority that they may respectively accept and wear the Insignia of the Fourth Class of the Imperial Ottoman Order of the Osmanieh, which decoration has been conferred upon them by His Highness the Khedive of Egypt, authorised by His Imperial Majesty the Sultan of Turkey, in recognition of valuable services rendered by them.

The King has been pleased to give and grant unto Captain William Christopher Pakenham, C.B., R.N., His Majesty's Royal licence and authority that he may accept and wear the Insignia of the Second Class of the Order of the Rising Sun, conferred upon him by His Majesty the Emperor of Japan, on the termination of his appointment as Naval Attaché to His Majesty's Embassy at Tokio.

WHITEHALL, April 18, 1906.

The King has been pleased to give and grant unto Arthur Fishel, Esq., His Majesty's Royal licence and authority that he may accept and wear the Insignia of the First Class of the Order of Saint Stanislas (being a promotion in that Order), which decoration has been conferred upon him by His Imperial Majesty the Emperor of Russia, in recognition of further valuable services rendered by him to His Imperial Majesty.
