- His Excellency Cavaliere Pansa, to present hisLetter of Recall as Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary from His Majesty the King of Italy;
- His Imperial Highness the Duke Tsai Tse and Their Excellencies Shang Chi Heng and Li Sheng Toh, on a Special Mission from His Majesty the Emperor of China, to present their Credentials. The Chinese Minister was also present;
