Whereas We have deemed it expedient that a Commission should forthwith issue to inquire into the expediency of instituting in Scotland a system of Registration of Title:

Now know ye, that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your knowledge, discretion, and ability, have nominated, constituted, and appointed, and do by these Presents nominate, constitute, and appoint you, the said Andrew Graham, Baron Dunedin of Stenton (Chairman); Sir Samuel Chisholm, Charles Fortescue Brickdale, James Smith Clark, William John Dundas, John Hope Finlay, Neil John Downie Kennedy, Ronald Crauford Munro Ferguson to be Our Commissioners for the purpose of the said inquiry.

And for the better enabling you, Our said Commissioners, to make the said enquiry, We do by these Presents authorise and empower you, or any three or more of you, to call before you, or any three or more of you, such persons as you shall judge necessary, by whom you may be the better informed of the matters herein submitted for your consideration, and every matter connected therewith; and also to call for, have access to, and examine all such books, documents, papers, or records as you shall judge likely to afford you the fullest information on the subject of this Our Commission; and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever:

And We do further by these Presents authorise and empower you, or any three or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places as you

may deem expedient for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid.

And Our further will and pleasure is that you, or any three or more of you, do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us, under your hands and seals, upon the matters referred to you as afore-said, and that you may have power to certify to Us, from time to time, your several proceedings in respect of the matters afore-said, if it may seem expedient to you so to do.

And We further will and command, and by these Presents ordain, that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

And for your assistance in the execution of these Presents, We do hereby nominate and appoint Our trusty and well-beloved John Lamb, Esquire, Advocate, to be Secretary to this Our Commission.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, the twenty-third day of May one thousand nine hundred and six, in the sixth year of Our Reign.
