SPECIAL REGULATIONS respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the situation of Assistant Surveyor of Taxes in the Department of Inland Revenue. (Supplementary to the General Regulations respecting Open Competitive Examinations for situations in the Civil Service, included in Schedule A of the Order in Council of 4th June 1870.)

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.

1. The limits of age for this situation are 19 and 22. Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of January of the year in which the Examination is held.

- 1. English Composition (including Spelling and Handwriting.
- 2. Arithmetic.
- 3. Accountancy (including Bookkeeping by Double Entry).
- 4. Political Economy.
- 5. Law of Evidence.
- 6. Latin, Translation and Composition.
- 7. French, Translation and Composition.
- 8. German, Translation and Composition.
- 9. Geography and English History,
- Geometry, the substance of Euclid, Books I.—IV., and VI.; and Algebra up to and including the Binomial Theorem.

Of the subjects numbered 6 to 10 not more than three may be taken.

3. Application for permission to attend **u** Examination must be made at such times and **u** such manner as the Commissioners may appoint.

4. A fee of £6 will be required from and Candidate attending the Examination.
