## INEBRIATES ACT, 1898.

NOTICE is hereby given, in pursuance of section 21 (2) of the Inebriates Act, 1898, that the Secretary for Scotland has made the following Regulation:—

I, the Right Honourable John Sinclair, His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, do hereby, by virtue of section 6 as read with section 25 of the Inebriates Act, 1898, make the following Regulation respecting the transfer of inebriates from a State Inebriate Reformatory in Scotland to a Certified Inebriate Reformatory:—

The Secretary for Scotland shall have power, in any case in which he thinks fit, to issue an order for the transfer to a Certified Inebriate Reformatory, the managers of which are willing to receive him, of any inmate of a State Inebriate Reformatory in Scotland; but should the Secretary for Scotland see fit at any subsequent date during the continuance of the inmate's term of detention to withdraw the order, he shall have power to do so and to order the recommitment of the inmate to the State Inebriate Reformatory.

\* Section 8 of the Corn Returns Act, 1882, provides that where returns of purchases of British Corn are made to the Local Inspector of Corn Returns in any other measure than the imperial bushel or by weight or by a weighed measure, that Officer shall convert such returns into the imperial bushel, and in the case of weight or weighed measure the conversion is to be made at the rate of sixty imperial pounds for every bushel of wheat, fifty imperial pounds for every bushel of barley, and thirty-nine imperial pounds for every bushel of oats.

**TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.**

1.
