PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS in an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the Fifth year of His Majesty's reign intituled "an Act to provide for the Settlement of certain Questions between

the Free Church and the United Free Church in Scotland and to make certain amendments of the law with respect to the Church of Scotland" is enacted that a Commission be established to consist of five Commissioners to be appointed by His Majesty:

And whereas it is further enacted in the Act aforesaid section three sub-section seven that "The powers of the Commission shall be in force until the first day of March nineteen hundred and six, but His Majesty may by Order in Council continue their powers for such further period as His Majesty thinks fit":

And whereas the said Commission was duly established by the appointment of five Commissioners in pursuance of a Warrant under His Majesty's Royal Sign Manual bearing date the eleventh day of August nineteen hundred and five:

And whereas His Majesty by Order in Council dated the sixteenth day of February nineteen bundred and six continued the powers of the said Commission until the first day of September nineteen hundred and six:

And whereas it is expedient that the powers of the said Commission should be continued for a further period:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the powers of the Commission established under the Act aforesaid shall be in force until the first day of January nineteen hundred and seven.
