TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. 4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

27th instant, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than twelve o'clock on Saturday the 29th instant.

6. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
