The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Secretary for Scotland has, under the provisions of the Burial Grounds (Scotland) Act, 1855, made a Representation stating that he has received a copy of an Interlocutor by the Sheriff-Substitute of Ayrshire at Kilmarnock, finding that the Burial Ground of the Parish of Stewarton, known as the Parish Churchyard (excepting the part thereof lying to the north-east, known as the "Private Burying Ground," enclosed within the boundary walls of the Churchyard, but divided therefrom by an iron railing) is in an overcrowded and insanitary condition, and is dangerous to health:

And whereas in the said Representation it is recommended that, from and after the 1st day of November 1907, or such earlier date as the new burial ground for the Parish of Stewarton shall be declared by Interlocutor of the Sheriff to be ready for use, the said burial ground (except "the Private Burying Ground") should be closed:

- Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased to give notice of such Representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the first day of February next:

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order, or notice thereof, be published in the Edinburgh Gazette, and that copies of this Order, or notice thereof, be affixed, as required by

the above-mentioned Act, on the doors of the Church of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parish affected by such Representation one month before such Representation is so considered.

\* Section 8 of the Corn Returns Act, 1882, provides that where returns of purchases of British Corn are made to the Local Inspector of Corn Returns in any other measure than the imperial bushel or by weight or by a weighed measure, that Officer shall convert such returns into the imperial bushel and in the case of weight or weighed measure the conversion is to be made at the rate of sixty imperial pounds for every bushel of wheat, fifty imperial pounds for every bushel of barley, and thirty-nine imperial pounds for every bushel of oats.
