**W**HEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Commission dated the fifth day of March one thousand nine hundred and seven, to nominate and appoint His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, in His Majesty's absence from His Realm in foreign parts, to hold on His Majesty's behalf, His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His approval of any matter or thing whereunto His Royal Highness should be so authorised by writing under His Majesty's Sign Manual, and to do further on His Majesty's behalf any matter or thing for the purposes of the said Commission whereunto His Royal Highness should be authorised in manner aforesaid :

And whereas by an Act passed in the forty-fifth and forty-sixth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria's reign, intituled "The Militia Act, 1882," it is, amongst other things, enacted that, save as therein otherwise provided, the Militia shall be trained and exercised for not less than twenty-one days, and not more than twenty-eight days, in every year, at such times and at such places in every part of the United Kingdom as His Majesty may appoint, and

also that His Majesty may, from time to time, with the advice of His Privy Council, order that the period of training and exercise, in any year, of all or any part of the Militia be extended, but so that the whole period of training and exercise be not more than fifty-six days ; and also, on the other hand, may order that in any year the annual training of all, or any part of the Militia, be dispensed with :

And whereas it is expedient for the year one thousand nine hundred and seven that the training of the Militia units hereinafter mentioned should be extended beyond the period of twenty-eight days :

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, being authorised thereto by writing under His Majesty's Sign Manual, doth hereby, on His Majesty's behalf, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, order and direct that for the year one thousand nine hundred and seven the period of training and exercise of the undermentioned Regiment of Militia shall be extended, under the provisions of the before cited Act, from twenty-eight days to fifty-six days, viz. :—

The Lancashire Royal Field Artillery ;  
that the period of training and exercise of the undermentioned Service Companies (specially trained for Bridging) and Depot Companies of Militia shall be extended from twenty-eight days to forty-eight days, viz. :—

Royal Anglesey Royal Engineers, and  
Royal Monmouthshire Royal Engineers ;  
that the period of training and exercise of the undermentioned Service Companies (specially

trained for Railway work) and Field Companies of Militia shall be extended from twenty-eight days to fifty-five days, viz. :—

Royal Anglesey Royal Engineers, and Royal Monmouthshire Royal Engineers ; that the period of training and exercise of the undermentioned Regiment of Militia shall be extended from twenty-eight days to forty-one days, viz. :—

The Cork Royal Garrison Artillery ; that the period of training and exercise of the undermentioned Regiments of Militia shall be reduced from twenty-one days to twenty days, viz. :—

**W**HEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Commission dated the fifth day of March one thousand nine hundred and seven, to nominate and appoint His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, in His Majesty's absence from His Realm in foreign parts, to hold on

His Majesty's behalf, His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His approval of any matter or thing whereunto His Royal Highness should be so authorised by writing under His Majesty's Sign Manual, and to do further on His Majesty's behalf any matter or thing for the purposes of the said Commission whereunto His Royal Highness should be authorised in manner aforesaid :

And whereas by section one hundred and three of the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks Act, 1883, as amended by section six of the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks (Amendment) Act, 1885, it is enacted as follows :—

1. If His Majesty is pleased to make any arrangement with the Government or Governments of any foreign State or States for mutual protection of inventions, designs and trade marks, or any of them, then any person who has applied for protection for any invention, design or trade mark in any such State shall be entitled to a patent for his invention or to registration of his design or trade mark (as the case may be) under this Act, in priority to other applicants, and such patent or registration shall have the same date as the date of the application in such foreign State.

Provided that his application is made in the case of a patent within seven months and in the case of a design or trade mark within four months from his applying for protection in the foreign State with which the arrangement is in force :

Provided that nothing in this section contained shall entitle the patentee or proprietor of the design or trade mark to recover damages for infringements happening prior to the date of the actual acceptance of his complete specification or the actual registration of his design or trade mark in this country as the case may be.

2. The publication in the United Kingdom or the Isle of Man during the respective periods aforesaid of any description of the invention or the use therein during such periods of the invention or the exhibition or use therein during such periods of the design or the publication therein during such periods of a description or representation of the design or the use therein during such periods of the trade mark shall not invalidate the patent which may be granted for the invention or the registration of the design or trade mark.

3. The application for the grant of a patent or the registration of a design or the registration of a trade mark under this section must be made in the same manner as an ordinary application under this Act, provided that in the case of trade marks any trade mark the registration of which has been duly applied for in the country of origin may be registered under this Act.

4. The provisions of this section shall apply only in the case of those foreign States with respect to which His Majesty shall from time to time by Order in Council declare them to be applicable and so long only in the case of each State as the Order in Council shall continue in force with respect to that State.

And whereas by section one hundred and four of the said first-mentioned Act it is enacted as follows :—

1. Where it is made to appear to His

Majesty that the legislature of any British possession has made satisfactory provision for the protection of inventions, designs and trade marks patented or registered in this country it shall be lawful for His Majesty from time to time by Order in Council to apply the provisions of the last preceding section with such variations or additions if any as to His Majesty in Council may seem fit to such British possession.

2. An Order in Council under this Act shall from a date to be mentioned for the purpose in the Order take effect as if its provisions had been contained in this Act; but it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to revoke any Order in Council made under this Act.

And whereas by section one of the Patents Act, 1901, it is enacted as follows :—

1.—(1) In the first proviso to sub-section one of section one hundred and three of the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks Act, 1883 (which section relates to the time for making applications for protection under international arrangements) the words "twelve months" shall be substituted for the words "seven months."

(2) An application under that section shall be accompanied by a complete specification which if it be not accepted within the period of twelve months shall with the drawings (if any) be open to public inspection at the expiration of that period.

And whereas by the Commonwealth of Australia Constitution Act, 1900, it was enacted that that Act and all laws made by the Parliament of the Commonwealth under the Constitution shall be binding on the Courts, Judges and people of every State and of every part of the Commonwealth notwithstanding anything in the laws of any State :

And whereas by the said last recited Act the Parliament of the Commonwealth were empowered to make laws for the peace, order and good government of the Commonwealth with respect to *inter alia*, copyrights, patents of inventions and designs and trade marks :

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, on behalf of His Majesty The King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, that the Parliament of the Commonwealth of Australia has made satisfactory provision for the protection of inventions, designs and trade marks patented or registered in this country :

Now, therefore, by virtue of the authority committed to His Majesty by the above enactments, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, being authorised in that behalf by writing under His Majesty's Sign Manual, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, doth hereby, on His Majesty's behalf, declare, and is hereby declared as follows :—

1. The provisions of section one hundred and three of the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks Act, 1883, as amended by section six of the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks (Amendment) Act, 1885, and by section one of the Patents Act, 1901, shall apply to the Commonwealth of Australia.

And it is hereby further declared that the Orders in Council dated respectively the

seventeenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eight-five, and the eleventh day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, by which Orders the provisions of section one hundred and three of the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks Act, 1883, were applied to the States of Queensland and Western Australia respectively shall as from the date of the coming into operation of this Order be repealed.

2. This Order in Council shall take effect from the first day of February, one thousand nine hundred and seven.
