CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION,

April 5, 1907.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the consent of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

REGULATIONS respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the Situation of Male Sorting Clerk and Telegraphist (Postal) in the Department of the Postmaster-General in Edinburgh, and certain other Towns.

These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.

1. The limits of age for this situation are 17 and 19. If an examination begins in January, February, or March in any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st day of January in that year. If an examination begins in April, May, or June in any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st day of April in that year. If an examination begins in July, August, or September in any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st day of July in that year. If an examination begins in October, November, or December in any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st day of October in that year.

2. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners—

- (a) That they are duly qualified in respect of health * and character.
- (b) That they are natural-born or naturalised British subjects.

3. At each Examination the number of Candidates to be selected will be such as the Postmaster-General may from time to time fix.

4. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz. :—

1. English Composition (including Writing and Spelling).
2. Arithmetic (first four rules, Simple and Compound, including English and Metrical Weights and Measures, Reduction, Vulgar Fractions and Decimals, excluding Reoccurring Decimals).
3. Geography (general).

Candidates who fail to obtain such an aggregate number of marks as may indicate, in the judgment

* Revaccination will be required before appointment unless the Candidate exhibits good marks of primary and secondary vaccination, or good marks of vaccination with definite evidence of having had smallpox.

of the Civil Service Commissioners, a competent amount of general proficiency, will not be regarded as qualified.

5. The standard height at 19 years of age is 5 feet 4 inches, and any Candidate under that height must distinctly understand that his services will cease if he fails to attain that height on reaching 19 years of age. Any Candidate who may have reached the age of 19 on or before the date on which the Examination begins must be at least 5 feet 4 inches in height at the time of the Examination.

6. (i.) Persons actually serving in the Army or Navy are ineligible to compete. (ii.) Persons holding situations in the Civil Service Probationary Engineer Cadets in the Navy, and Apprentices in His Majesty's Dockyards, must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the Examination before the commencement of the Competition.

7. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

8. A fee of 4s. will be required from every Candidate attending an Examination.
