WILD BIRDS (SCOTLAND).

THE WILD BIRDS PROTECTION (COUNTY OF ZETLAND) ORDER, 1907.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904, and upon application by the County Council of the County of Zetland, I, the Right Honourable John Sinclair, His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, do hereby make the following Order:—

1. The whole of the County of Zetland is hereby exempted from the operation of the Act of 1880 as to the under-mentioned birds:—

Lesser Black-backed Gull. Herring Gull. Cormorant. Shag.

2. This Order shall come into force on the first day of May 1907, and shall be published in

the London Gazette and in the Edinburgh Gazette.

3. This Order may be cited as the "Wild Birds Protection (County of Zetland) Order, 1907."

^{*} Section 8 of the Corn Returns Act, 1882, provides that where returns of purchases of British Corn are made to the Local Inspector of Corn Returns in any other measure than the imperial bushel or by weight or by a weighed measure, that Officer shall convert such returns into the imperial bushel, and in the case of weight or weighed measure the conversion is to be made at the rate of sixty imperial pounds for every bushel of wheat, fifty imperial pounds for every bushel of barley, and thirty-nine imperial pounds for every bushel of oats.
