The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the consent of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

REGULATIONS (framed in pursuance of Act 40 and 41 Vict. cap. 57) respecting Open Competitive Examinations for Junior Clerkships in the High Court of Justice, Ireland.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.

1. Open Competitive Examinations of Candidates for this situation will be held from time to time as may be deemed expedient.

2. These Examinations are open to all natural-born or naturalised British subjects, being of the prescribed age, and of good health and character.

3. The limits of age for this situation are 20 and 25. Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the Examination.

4. The subjects of Examination will be as follows :—

All Candidates will be required to satisfy the Commissioners in subjects 1 to 9.

The subjects 10, 11, 12, and 13 are optional.

5. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made in the writing of the Candidate, at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

6. A fee of £3 will be required from each Candidate attending an Examination.

7. At each Examination will be filled (provided there be Candidates duly qualified) (a) the vacancies existing at the time of the Examination; (b) any additional vacancies occurring within six months from the date of the announcement of the result of the Examination which the Lord Chancellor of Ireland may desire to have so filled.

CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION,

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that an Open Competitive Examination of Candidates for registration as Temporary Boy Clerks will be held in London, Edinburgh, Dublin, Bedford, Bristol, Liverpool, Southampton, Aberdeen, Glasgow, Belfast, and Cork, commencing on the 24th September 1907, under the Regulations dated the 1st February 1907, and published in the London Gazette of the same date (as amended by a notice published in the London Gazette of the 26th April 1907.

The number to be registered will depend partly on the requirements of the service, and partly on the number of Candidates who may show sufficient proficiency; but it is not likely to be less than 215, if so many shall be found competent; that is to say, 200 for service in London, Edinburgh, and provincial towns in England, Scotland, and Wales, and 15 for service in Dublin and provincial towns of Ireland exclusively.

No Candidate will be admitted to the Examination from whom the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, has not received, on or before the 29th August, an application, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury give notice, under section 8 of the Sinking Fund Act, 1875 (38 and 39 Vict., c. 45), that £1,000,000 on account of the Old Sinking Fund for 1906-7 will be issued in the current quarter to the National Debt Commissioners.
