bearing date the 5th day of June 1907, passed
under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom, to
provide for the establishment of Responsible
Government in the Orange River Colony; and
by further Letters Patent, bearing even date there-
with, to reconstitute the Office of Governor and
Commander-in-Chief of that Colony.

His Majesty has also been pleased to appoint
Major Sir Hamilton John Goold-A dams, K.C.M.G.,
C.B. (Lieutenant-Governor), to be Governor and
Commander-in-Chief of the Orange River Colony
on the coming into force of the Letters Patent of
the 5th day of June 1907, constituting the Office
of Governor of the Colony.
