HER Majesty The Queen has been pleased to appoint the Marchioness of Salisbury as Lady of the Bedchamber to Her Majesty, in the place of Lady Emily Kingscote, resigned.

WHEREAS the Secretary for Scotland has, under the provisions of the Burial Grounds (Scotland) Act, 1855, made a Representation, stating that he has received copies of Interlocutors by the Sheriff of Ross and Cromarty at Stornoway finding that the Burial Grounds at Little Bernera and Kirivig, situated in the Parish of Uig, are so crowded with bodies as to be contrary to decency.

And whereas in the said Representation it is recommended that the said Burial Grounds should be closed, except for the burial of any person, widow or widower, whose husband or wife has been buried in either of the said Burial Grounds, and subject to the conditions as regards all interments in the said Burial Grounds after the date of the Order in Council directing the closing of the said Burial Grounds, (1) that the exercise of the right of burial shall not be injurious to the public health, or offensive or contrary to decency; (2) that notice shall be given to the

Clerk to the Lewis District Committee, Stornoway, on the day preceding that on which a grave is to be opened; (3) that no interment shall be made unless the coffin can be laid at a depth of three feet at least, and where possible at a depth of four feet, from the surface of the ground to the upper side of the coffin, and that without the exposure of another coffin:

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased to give notice of such Representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the 17th day of August next:

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order, or notice thereof, be published in the Edinburgh Gazette, and that copies of this Order, or notice thereof, be affixed, as required by the above-mentioned Act, on the doors of the Church of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representations one month before such Representations are so considered.
