# TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Monday the 22nd instant, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vict. cap. 2, and 52 Vict. cap. 6, to the amount of £2,500,000, being £1,000,000 in replacement of Bills falling due on the 28th instant, and £1,500,000 in replacement of the balance of those temporarily paid off on 12th April 1907.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1000, £5000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 27th July 1907, and will be payable at six months after date, viz.:—on the 27th January 1908.
- 3. The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for;

- 4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

# CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION, July 16, 1907.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the consent of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :-

REGULATIONS respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the Situation of Valuer and Surveyor (Second Section) in the Department of the General Valuation and Boundary Survey of Ireland.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.

I. The limits of age for this situation are 22 and 28, and Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the Examination.

In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made, viz. :-

(i.) Persons who have served in the Army or Navy may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have served;

- (ii.) Persons who may be serving or who may have served in the Militia, the Imperial Yeomanry, the Honourable Artillery Company, or the Volunteers, may deduct from their actual age any time spent on actual military service, such time being reckoned by the number of days for which they
- received Army pay; (iii.) Persons who have served for two full consecutive years-
  - (A) In any Civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners,

(B) In the Royal Irish Constabulary, or

- (C) As Registered Boy Clerks in connection with the Civil Service,
- may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding five years which they may have spent in such service.

II. Candidates will be required to show what technical education and preliminary training they have undergone to qualify themselves for a situation of this nature. They must show (1) that they have served for at least two years in a public or private office under a Civil Engineer, Architect, or Surveyor; (2) that the works on which they have been engaged during those years were such as to afford them the opportunity of gaining a satisfactory knowledge of their profession; and (3) that thay have fully profited

and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank dence on these points must be sent in at such times and in such manner as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint. If such evidence should prove primâ facie satisfactory, the Candidate will be admitted to examination, subject, in the case of his being successful in the competition, to such further inquiry, and the production of such further evidence as may be necessary.

> III. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz. :-

- 1. English Composition (including Handwriting and Orthography).
- 2. Arithmetic.
- 3. Land Surveying, including Draughtsmanship and the making and plotting of Surveys; and either
- 4. Architectural Surveying and Valuing; or
- 5. Practical Farming, including the elements of Geology and Chemistry as applied to Agriculture, and Land Valuing.

In subjects 3, 4, and 5 there will be an Oral and Practical Examination.

Candidates must pass to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners in subjects numbered 1, 2, 3, and must obtain such an aggregate of marks in the Examination, as a whole, as may indicate in the judgment of the Civil Service Commissioners a competent amount of general proficiency.

IV. Subject to the provisions of Clause II. of these regulations the examinations are open to all natural-born or naturalised British subjects, being of the requisite age, health, and character, with the following restrictions:-

- (i.) The following persons are ineligible, viz :-Members of the Royal Irish Constabulary of less than five years' service.
- (ii.) The following classes of persons are eligible under certain conditions only, that is to say:-
  - (a) Persons actually serving in the Army. (b) Persons actually serving in the Navy.
  - (c) Persons holding situations in the Civil Service.
  - (d) Members of the Royal Irish Constabulary of more than five years' service.
  - (e) Probationary Engineer Cadets in the Navy and Apprentices in His Majestys Dockvards.
  - (f) Persons who have been trained in Training Colleges at the public expense
  - (g) Persons who have been trained in the Inland Revenue Branch of the Government Laboratory.
  - No person actually serving in the Army will be eligible unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination dated before the commencement of the competition and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued by or under the authority of the Army Council.
  - No person actually serving in the Navy will be eligible unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of

his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued by or under the authority of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty.

Persons comprised in the classes (c), (d), (e) must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the competition.

Persons comprised in class  $(\hat{f})$  will not be qualified to receive appointments until the consent of the Board of Education in England, the Committee of Council on Education for Scotland, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, as the case may be, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

Persons comprised in class (g) will not be qualified for appointment until the consent of the Board of Inland Revenue, given with the like sanction, has been

notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

V. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such time and in such manner as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint.

VI. A fee of £3 will be required from every Candidate attending an Examination.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination for the Situation of Valuer and Surveyor (Second Section) in the Department of the General Valuation and Boundary Survey of Ireland will be held in London and Dublin, under the foregoing Regulations, commencing on the 8th October 1907.

The number of situations to be filled will be the number vacant at the time of the Examination.

No person will be admitted to Examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 19th September, an application, in the Candidate's own handwriting, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

<sup>\*</sup> Section 8 of the Corn Returns Act, 1882, provides that where returns of purchases of British Coin are made to the Local Inspector of Corn Returns in any other measure than the imperial bushel or by weight or by a weighed measure, that Officer shall convert such returns into the imperial bushel, and in the case of weight or weighed measure the conversion is to be made at the rate of sixty imperial pounds for every bushel of wheat, fifty imperial pounds for every bushel of barley, and thirty-nine imperial pounds for every bushel of oats.
