Copy of a letter from the Hon. Admiral Cornwal-lis, &c. to William Marsden, Esq. dated on board his Majesty's ship the Ville de Paris, off the Start, 7th December 1804.

I have the honour to enclose, for the in formation of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, a letter to me from Captain Dundas, of the Naiad, giving an account of the capture of the Ftench gun boats therein mentioned, by that ship.

Naiad, off Breft, Nov. 27. I beg leave to acquaint you, that at day light this morning, feeing fome small vessels at a short distance from us, and shortly atterwards perceiving a fire of musketry from them on the boats of his Majefty's fhip L'Aigle, which Captain Wolfe had fention chace of them, I made fail, and cut off two. which prove to be gun-boats Nos. 361 and 369, mounting each one long brais four pounder, and one short twelve, from Dandiorne bound to Brest, having on board a Lieutenant of the 63d regiment of infantry, and 36 privates, belides 5 seaften belonging to each vessel, being part of 16 that had sailed from that port on a similar destinafailed from that port on a fimilar destination. I ham forry to acquaint you that two
seamen belonging to L'Aigle are wounded,
(Wm. Shephard and James Mitchell), the
latter dangerously. I have given Captain
Hawkins, of his Majesty's sloop Dispatch,
orders to proceed to Plymouth with the
two vessels, which I think worth preserving, and to land the prisoners.
