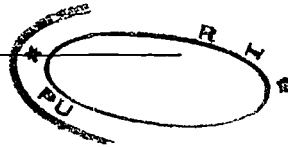

FURTHER REGULATIONS AS TO FEES.

THE MOTOR CARS REGULATION (BURGH OF KILMARNOCK) ORDER, 1907, dated 19th August 1907.

Whereas by section 9, as read with section 18, of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is provided that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Secretary for Scotland with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the Local Authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

And whereas by section 10, as read with section 18, of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is provided that Local Authorities, within the meaning of section 9 of the said Act, shall give public notice of any regulation of the Secretary for Scotland, made in pursuance of the said Act, prohibiting or restricting the use of motor cars on any highway, or part of a highway, or limiting the speed of motor cars within any limits or place, and for the
