NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That, acting under commission from the Secretary for Scotland, John M'Kie Lees, Esq., K.C., Sheriff of Stirling, Dumbaron, and Clackmannan, will, within the Sheriff Court-House, Dumbaron, on Saturday the 7th day of September proximo, at eleven o'clock forenoon, hold a Public Inquiry in regard to representation made to the Secretary for Scotland by the County Council of the County of Dunbarton, in terms of section 51 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1889, and wherein it is prayed that the Secretary for Scotland may be pleased to issue an Order or Orders altering the existing boundaries of the Electoral Divisions known as Old Kilpatrick Electoral Division and Duntocher Electoral Division so that the portions of said Electoral Divisions now included in and forming the Fifth Municipal Ward of the Burgh of Clydebank, shall be formed into a new and additional Electoral Division to be known as Clydebank Fifth Ward Electoral Division; that the boundaries of Old Kilpatrick and Duntocher Electoral Divisions be correspondingly altered so as to exclude therefrom the portions thereof included within the limits of the Burgh of Clydebank; that the number of County Councillors for the County be increased from 40 to 41; and that the additional County Councillor be assigned to a new and additional Electoral Division to be formed and known as above mentioned.
