The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that an Open Competitive Examination for situations as Assistant of Excise in the Inland Revenue Department, will be held in London, Edinburgh, Dublin, Birmingham, Bristol, Cardiff, Leeds, Liverpool, Manchester, Newcastle-on-Tyne, Plymouth, Portsmouth, Aberdeen, Glasgow, Belfast, Cork, Limerick, and Londonderry, commencing on the 10th December 1907, under the Regulations dated 18th January 1907, and published in the London Gazette of the same date.
