WHITEHALL, September 27, 1907.

The King has been pleased, by Warrant under His Majesty's Royal Sign Manual, bearing date the 19th August 1907, to ordain and declare that Lilla Billson, widow and relict of Alfred Billson, Esquire, late representative in Parliament for the North-Western Division of the County of Stafford, shall have, hold, and enjoy the style, title, place, and precedence to which she would have been entitled had her husband survived to receive the honour of Knight Bachelor at the hands of His Majesty.

The Royal order and declaration will be registered in the College of Arms.

WHITEHALL, September 30, 1907.

The King has been pleased by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date the 16th instant, to ordain that the Chief Magistrate now
