### ADMIRALTY-OFFICE, DEC. 17.

SIR,  
 Have the satisfaction to inform you, that I yesterday fell in with two French lugger privateers, and that after a chase of three hours I captured la Racchocheuse, Captain Jacques Broquant, out one day from St Vallery en Caux, mounting 14 guns, four-pounders, and carrying 46 men. The above luggers had in their possession a brig, and were boarding a bark, both which they quitted on my approaching them; I therefore made signal to a cutter then in sight, which I believe to be the Countess of Elgin, to chase the merchant vessels, and from the exertions I observed her to make, I have no doubt but she has succeeded.

The luggers steering different courses, the headmost one escaped, her name is l'Adolphe, mounting the same number of guns as the capture, belongs to the same port, where she must have returned, having thrown every thing overboard in the chase. I am, &c.
