Phave the satisfaction to inform you, that I yester ay fell in with two French lugger privateers, and, that after a chace of three hours I captured la Raccrocheuse, Captain Jacques Broquant, out one day from St Vallery en Caux, mounting 14 guns, four-pounders, and carrying 46 men. The above luggers had in their possession a brig, and were boarding a bark, both which they quitted on my approaching them; I therefore made signal to a cutter then in sight, which I believe to be the Counters of Elgin, to chace the merchant vessels, and from the exertions I observed her to make, I have no doubt but she has succeeded.

The luggers steering different courses, the headmost one escaped, her name is I Adolphe, mounting the same number of guns as the capture, belongs to the same port, where she must have returned, having thrown every thing overboard in the chace, I am, &c.
