THE MOTOR CARS REGULATION (COUNTY OF WIGTOWN) (No. 2) ORDER, 1907, dated 26th October 1907, regulating the Speed of Motor Cars within certain Limits or Places in the County of Wigtown.

Whereas by section 9 as read with section 18 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is provided that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Secretary for Scotland with a view to the safety of the public on the application of the Local Authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

And whereas by section 10 as read with section 18 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is provided that Local Authorities within the meaning of section 9 of the said Act shall give public notice of any regulations of the Secretary for Scotland made in pursuance of the said Act prohibiting or restricting the use of motor cars on any highway or part of a highway, or limiting the speed of motor cars, within any limits or place, and for the purpose of giving effect to any such regulation shall place notices in conspicuous places on or near the highway, part of a highway, limits or place, to which the regulation refers:

And whereas the County Council of the County of Wigtown, being the Local Authority of the said County, have applied to the Secretary for Scotland to make regulations under Section 9 of the said Act, and I am of opinion that it is desirable to give effect to the said application to the extent hereinafter mentioned:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers vested in me in that behalf, I, the Right Honourable John Sinclair, His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, do hereby make the following Regulations under the said Section 9:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Motor Cars Regulation (County of Wigtown) (No. 2) Order, 1907," and the regulations hereby prescribed shall take effect within the limits or places referred to therein on and after the respective dates at which, for the purpose of giving effect thereto, the Local Authority shall place notices in conspicuous places on or near such limits or places.
2. A person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour within the limits or places specified in the Schedule to this Order.

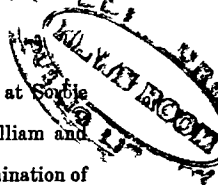

THE MOTOR CARS REGULATION (COUNTY OF WIGTOWN) (No. 1) ORDER, 1907, dated 26th October 1907, prohibiting Motor Car Traffic on certain Highways in the County of Wigtown.

Whereas by section 8, as read with section 18, of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is provided that the Secretary for Scotland may, in Scotland, by regulations made under section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896, prohibit or restrict the driving of any motor cars, or of any special kind of motor cars, on any specified highway, or part of a highway, which does not exceed sixteen feet in width, or on which ordinary motor car traffic would, in his opinion, be especially dangerous:

And whereas by section 10, as read with section 18, of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is provided that Local Authorities, within the meaning of section 9 of the said Act, shall give public notice of any regulation of the Secretary for Scotland, made in pursuance of the said Act, prohibiting or restricting the use of motor cars on any highway, or part of a highway, or limiting the speed of motor cars within any limits or place, and for the purpose of giving effect to any such regulation shall place notices in conspicuous places on or near the highway, part of a highway, limits or place, to which the regulation refers:

And whereas the County Council of the County of Wigtown, being the Local Authority of the said County, have applied to me to make regulations under the said Acts, and I am of opinion that it is desirable to give effect to the said application to the extent hereinafter mentioned.

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers vested in me in that behalf, I, the Right Honourable John Sinclair, His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, do hereby make the following regulations under section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896, as read with section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Motor Cars Regulation (County of Wigtown) (No. 1) Order, 1907," and the regulations hereby prescribed shall take effect on the highways or parts of highways specified therein on and after the respective dates at which, for the purpose of giving effect thereto, the Local Authority shall place notices in conspicuous places on or near such highways or parts of highways.

2. No person shall cause or permit a motor car to be driven, or shall drive a motor car, on such part of any highway named in the second column of the schedule to this Order as is defined in the third column of the said Schedule.

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that on the 21st October 1907 he made the following Order:—

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Section 130 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, I hereby direct that the occupier of every factory, workshop, and laundry shall, on or before the 1st day of March 1908, send to the Chief Inspector of Factories a correct return, specifying with respect to the period from 1st January to the 31st December 1907 the number of persons employed in the factory, workshop, or laundry, with the particulars as to age, sex, or occupation which are shown in the First Schedule hereto.

And I also further direct that the occupier of every factory, where china or

earthenware is manufactured, and where special rules are in force, shall, on or before the 1st day of March 1908, send to the Chief Inspector of Factories, in addition to the particulars mentioned in the first paragraph hereof, a correct return specifying for the same period the number of persons employed in the factory in every process involving exposure to lead, with the particulars as to age, sex, and occupation, which are shown in the Form of Return in the Second Schedule hereto.
