The King's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council

The King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. Whereas information has been received, that an Embargo has been ordered to be laid upon all British ships in the ports of the kingdom of Spain; it is this day ordered by his Majesty, by and with the advice of his Privy Council, that no ships or vessels belonging to any of his Majesty's subjects be permitted to enter and clear out for any of the ports of Spain, until further orders: And his Majesty is surther pleased to order, that a General Embargo or stop be made of all Spanish ships and vessels whatsover, now within, or which hereaster shall come into any of the ports, harbours, or roads, within the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, together with all persons and effects on board the said ships and vessels; but that the utmost care be taken for the preservation of all and every part of the cargoes on board any of the faid ships, so that no damage or embezzlement whatever he sustained: And the Right Hon, the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
