ORDER by the Local Government Board for Scotland Dissolving a Combination of certain Local Authorities for enforcing the provisions of Part IV. of the Public Health (Scotland) Act, 1897.

WHEREAS We, the Local Government Board for Scotland, by an Order, dated the 24th day of November 1898, in pursuance of our powers under section 83 of the Public Health (Scotland) Act, 1897, authorised or required the Local Authorities under the said Act hereinafter specified to act together for the purposes of Part IV. of the aforesaid Act within their respective jurisdictions in and over the waters of that arm of the sea commonly called the Cromarty Firth, namely:—

1. The District Committee of Easter Ross, in the County of Ross and Cromarty;
2. The District Committee of the Black Isle, in the said County;
3. The District Committee of Mid Ross, in the said County;
4. The Magistrates and Town Council of the Burgh of Dingwall;
5. The Magistrates and Town Council of the Burgh of Invergordon; and
6. The Magistrates and Town Council of the Burgh of Cromarty.

And whereas We, also in the aforesaid Order, prescribed the mode of such joint action and of defraying the costs thereof:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Order should be revoked.

Now therefore We, the Local Government Board for Scotland, by this our Order, revoke the above-cited Order, dated the twenty-fourth day of November one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight years.
