FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, pursuant to section 3 (3) of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that on the 13th October 1908 he made the following Orders under the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901:—
