FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, pursuant to section 86 (1) of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, that on the 18th December 1908 he made Regulations under section 79 of the said Act in respect of the use of East Indian Wool, to come into force on the 1st January 1909, and to apply to all factories in which East Indian Wool is used.
