Extract of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Rainier, Commander in Chief of his Majesty's ships and vessels in the East Indies, to William Marsden, Esq. dated in Mangalore Roads, the 10th of March 1804.

Three privateers have been captured by his Majesty's ships, as per margin :

- L'Epigle, of two guns, by Dedaigneuse.
- Le Passé par Tout, (chasse marée, of two guns and six swivels, by St Fiorenzo.
- Le Freres Unis, of eight guns, by Caroline.
