Copy of a Letter from the Honourable William Cornwalls, K. B. Admiral of the White, &c. to William Marsden, Esq. dated on board the Ville de Paris, off Ushant, the 13th February 1805.

SIR-I have the honour to enclose, for the information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, a letter to me from Captain Poyntz, of the Melampus, and one from Lieutenant Ni-cholson, commanding the Frisk cutter, giving ac-counts of the capture of the enemy's gun-vessels therein mentioned.

Melampus, off Ushant, Feb. 13. 1805.

Sir-I have the honour to inform you, that I, this morning, fell in with, and captured two gun-brigs, carrying two long twenty-four poundcis and one eighteen pounder each, having on board fifty men, the greater part foldiers; also four luggers, mounting one long eighteen pounder each, manned with twenty-five men, mostly sol-

These vessels are part of twenty-seven of the fame description, from Bourdeaux to Brest; two more were captured (lugger rigged) early the fame morning by the Rhoda and Frisk atmed cutters. I have the honour to be, &c.

His Majesty's hired cutter Frisk, at sea, 13th Feb. 1805.

I have the honour to acquaint you, that, at day light yesterday, (the Rhoda cutter in company,) I discovered ten sail of the enemy's gunbrigs and luggers had come through the passage du Raz, and the wind blowing fresh to the eastward, they were not able to get to windward: I immediately gave chace to the weathermost, a lugger, and at half past seven (Point du Raz S. S. W. distant sive miles) I captured her, and S. S. W. distant five miles) I captured her, and sent her to Plymouth. She proves to be No. 288, gun-vessel, mounting one long twenty-four pounder, with twenty-five men, twenty of whom
