TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Wednesday the 12th instant, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vict., cap. 2, 52 Vict., cap. 6, and 9 Edw. VII., cap. 5, to the amount of £4,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1000, £5000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 17th January 1910, and will be payable at two months after date, viz., on the 17th March 1910.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for, and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Thursday the 13th instant, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than three o'clock, on Monday the 17th January 1910.

6. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
