NOTICE.-The Public Health (Scotland) Act, 1897, provides by Section 87 that if any person. wilfully neglects or refuses to obey or carry out, or obstructs the execution of, any regulation made under Part IV. of the Act, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty not exceeding fi/ty pounds for every day during which the offence continues: and any such penalty shall be recoverable with expenses at the instance of the Lord-Advocate on behalf of the Board, or by any Local Authority with the consent of the Board in any competent Court. The power of making regulations under Part IV. of the Public Health (Scotland) Act, 1897, is enlarged by the Public Health (Regulations as to Food) Act, 1907.


