(2) Unless the Board otherwise direct, the

following provisions shall apply:—

(i.) Notice of intention to apply for confirmation of any regulations shall be given in one or more of the local newspapers circulating within the District two weeks at least before the making of the application.

(ii.) For two weeks at least before an application a copy of the regulations proposed to be confirmed shall be kept at the office of the Local Authority of the District, and he open during office hours thereat to the inspection of ratepayers of the District without fee or reward.

(iii.) The Clerk of the Local Authority shall on the application of any such rate-payer furnish him with a copy of the proposed

regulations on payment of sixpence.

(3) A copy of any regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the regulations, without further or other proof.

## Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the DISEASES OF ANIMALS (EDINBURGH AND MID-LOTHIAN) ORDER OF 1910.
