ALLOA ELECTRIC LIGHTING
(EXTENSION).

(The Supply of Electricity by the Town Council of the Burgh of Alloa, in the County of Clackmannan, in that portion of the Parish of Alloa added in the year 1905 to the said Burgh: Amendment of the Alloa Electric Lighting Order, 1899, and application of that Order to added area; and other purposes.)

NOTICE is hereby given that the Town Council of the Burgh of Alloa (who are hereinafter called "the Corporation," and whose address is the Municipal Buildings, Alloa), intend to apply to the Board of Trade, on or before the 21st day of December next, for a Provisional Order (hereinafter called "the Order") under the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 to 1909, for all or some of the following, amongst other, purposes (that is to say):—

1. To extend the area of supply of the Corporation, under the Alloa Electric Lighting Order, 1899, so as to include therein so much of the Parish of Alloa as was added to the Burgh of Alloa by the interlocutor or deliverance of the Sheriff of Clackmannanshire of the 7th day of September, 1905 (the said area of supply so extended being hereinafter referred to as "the extended area of supply"), and to authorise the Corporation to generate, supply, distribute and sell electrical energy for public and private purposes, as defined by the said Electric Lighting Acts, within the extended area of supply.

2. To incorporate with the Order and generally to extend and make applicable to the extended area of supply all or some of the provisions contained in schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899, as may be deemed necessary to apply to the undertaking to be authorised by the Order, subject to such variations and exceptions as may be contained therein, and if deemed desirable to extend those provisions to the existing area of supply of the Corporation, and to repeal so much of the Alloa Electric Lighting Order, 1899, as will thereby be rendered unnecessary.

3. To confer upon the Corporation all or some of the powers of the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 to 1909, and enactments incorporated therewith, and to prescribe the price to be charged for Electric Energy and other rates, rents and charges, and to alter, vary, or extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might interfere with any of the objects of the Order, and to confer all other rights and privileges necessary for carrying such objects into effect.

4. To alter, extend and amend or to repeal some or all of the provisions of the Alloa Electric Lighting Order, 1899, and the said interlocutor or deliverance of the Sheriff of Clackmannanshire of the 7th day of September, 1905.

5. The Streets, or parts of streets, in which it is proposed that Electric lines shall be laid down within a specified time are as follows:—Part of Kelliebank Road commencing at a point 478 yards, or thereby, from the East end of said road, thence extending 37 yards, or thereby, along said road in a westerly direction to a point opposite the footway from Kelliebank Road to Smithfield Loan, thence from the last-mentioned point extending along the footpath to the British Electric Plant Company's Works in a northerly direction a distance of 166 yards, or thereby.

Part of Claremont commencing at a point 127 yards, or thereby, measured in a north-westerly direction from the centre of Alexandra Drive, thence in a north-westerly direction along Claremont 83 yards, or thereby, to Norwood North Lodge.

6. The following are the streets not repairable by the local authority, railways and tramways, which the Corporation propose to take power to break up:—

Streets—None.

Railway—The North British Railway.

Tramway—The tramway at Messrs. W. R. & John Carmichael's Brick Works.

And Notice is hereby given that a draft of the Order will be deposited at the Office of the Board of Trade on or before the 21st day of December next, and printed copies of the draft Order when deposited, and of the Order when made, may be obtained at the price of One Shilling for each copy, at the offices of the under-mentioned Town Clerk and Parliamentary Agents, and at the office of the British Electric Plant Company, Alloa.

And Notice is hereby further given that a Map shewing the boundaries of the proposed extension of the area of supply, and the streets in which it is proposed that electric lines shall be laid down within a specified time, and a copy of this advertisement, as published in the "Edinburgh Gazette," will be deposited on or before the 30th day of November, 1910, at the Office of the Board of Trade, and also for public inspection in the office in Alloa of the Principal Sheriff Clerk of the County of Clackmannan, and in the office of the Town Clerk of the Burgh of Alloa, Municipal Buildings, Alloa, and also in the office of the Clerk of the Parliaments, House of Lords, and in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons.

And Notice is hereby lastly given that every local or other public authority, company, or person, desirous of bringing before the Board of Trade any objection respecting the application must do so by letter addressed to the Board of Trade, marked on the outside of the cover enclosing it, "Electric Lighting Acts," on or before the 15th day of January, 1911, and a copy of such objection must also be forwarded to the under-mentioned Town Clerk, or Parliamentary Agents.
