CORONATION OF THEIR MAJESTIES. COURT OF CLAIMS.

The Right Honourable the Commissioners appointed by His Majesty for the purpose will meet at the Council Office, Whitehall, on Friday the 27th day of January next, at eleven o'clock of the forenoon, to hear and determine Claims of Service to be performed at the time of the ensuing Coronation (except those dispensed with by His Majesty's Royal Proclamation of the 19th day of July last), and of fees to be received for the same.

The Commissioners at their meeting held on the 16th day of December last resolved as follows :---

1. All Claims must be made by Petition. Petitions may be sent under cover to the Clerks of the Court of Claims, Privy Council Office, Downing Street, London, S.W.

2. Petitioners are not required to appear in person unless summoned.

3. Petitioners may appear by Counsel,. Solicitors, or Agents.

4. If a Claim was admitted in 1901-2, all that is required from the Petitioner (or his present representative) is a short formal Petition (without Appearance) stating that he is the same Petitioner, or his representative (and if representative in what capacity), and that the Petition was allowed in 1901-2, in order that there may be a record.

5. No Claim excluded by the Court in 1901-2 as inappropriate to the Coronation by reason of the Royal Proclamation, and inappropriate for the same reason to the forthcoming Coronation, will be placed on the list.

6. Any Claim now made, which was referred by the Court in 1901-2 to the Executive Committee for the purposes of arrangements for the Coronation, shall be referred to the same Committee.

PROPOSED ORDER BY THE SCOTCH EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

SCHOOL BOARD OF GLASGOW.

SCHOOL BOARD OF MARYHILL.

SCHOOL BOARD OF SPRINGBURN.

HEREAS by section 22, subsection (1) of the Education (Scotland) Act, 1908, it is enacted that where it is represented to the Department by a school board that it would be expedient that the district or part of a district of the said school board should be united with the adjacent district or part of district of another school board so as for all purposes to constitute a district under one school board, the Department shall consult with the authorities concerned and may cause a local inquiry to be held, and, if they are of opinion that the districts should be united, may by order provide for uniting the said districts as aforesaid

And whereas it has been represented to the Department by the School Board of Glasgow that it would be expedient that the district of the said School Board should be united with (1) the adjacent district of the School Board of Maryhill, and (2) the adjacent district of the School Board of Springburn so as for all purposes to constitute a district under one School Board :

And whereas the Department have consulted with the said School Board of Maryhill and the said School Board of Springburn, being the authorities concerned, and the said School Boards are agreed that their respective districts should be united as aforesaid with the district of the School Board of Glasgow :

And whereas after due consideration of the matter the Department are of opinion that the said districts should be united as aforesaid :

And whereas it is expedient that the said districts should be united as aforesaid :

Now therefore the Department in terms of the section above recited and in virtue of the powers in that behalf conferred upon them have ordered and hereby order as follows, videlicit :-

1. From and after the date of the commencement of this Order, the School Board of Maryhill and the School Board of Springburn shall cease to exist, and the districts of the said School Boards shall be united with the district of the School Board of Glasgow so as for all purposes to constitute a district under the School Board of Glasgow.

2. The said School Board of Glasgow shall consist of twenty-five members. The members of the said School Board shall be elected for the first time on Friday, the thirty-first day of March 1911, conform to such regulations as may be prescribed by the Department in virtue of their statutory powers, and the Clerk to the existing School Board of Glasgow, is hereby appointed returning officer on the occasion of that election.

3. Save as in hereinafter provided, the School Board of Glasgow shall take over all the teachers, officers, clerks, janitors and other servants, in the employment of the said School Boards of Maryhill and Springburn at the date of the commencement of this Order, and the said teachers, officers, clerks, janitors, and other servants shall become teachers, officers, clerks, janitors and servants of the School Board of Glasgow, upon the same terms and subject to the same conditions with respect to salary, promotion, retiring allowance, and all other matters as the teachers, officers, clerks, janitors, and other servants already in the employment of the said School Board, and shall receive from the said School Board not less salary, wages, or other remuneration than they may have become entitled to receive from the School Board of Maryhill or the School Board of Springburn as the case may be at the last ordinary revision of salaries, wages, or other remuneration prior to the date thereof:

Provided always (1) that the School Board of Glasgow shall not be bound to take over the Clerk and Treasurer or the principal attendance officer of the School Board of Maryhill, but in the event of their resolving not to do so, or in the event of one or other or both of the said Clerk and Treasurer, and the said principal attendance officer preferring not to enter the service of the School Board of Glasgow, such officer or officers shall, subject to the approval of the Department, receive compensation from the School Board of Glasgow calculated at a rate not less than that provided for "existing officers" by section 120 of the Local Government (Scotland)

Act, 1889; and (2) that the School Board of Glasgow shall not be bound to take over the Clerk and Treasurer to the School Board of Springburn, but such officer shall receive a gratuity of one hundred pounds as compensation from the School Board of Glasgow.

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4. From and after the date of the commencement of this Order the whole property heritable and moveable, real and personal, belonging to the School Boards of Maryhill and Springburn, whether held by them in absolute ownership or in trust shall be vested in and become the property in absolute ownership or in trust, as the case may be, of the School Board of Glasgow. And all debts, obligations, liabilities, prestations, and others, including, without prejudice to the foregoing generality, building debts and obligations for retiring allowances, in which at the date hereof the School Boards of Maryhill and Springburn may be respectively liable, shall from and after the date of the commencement of this Order become debts, obligations, liabilities, prestations, and others, of the School Board of Glasgow, who shall implement and discharge the same from time to time as they severally become due.

5. In this Order the expression "the Depart-ment" means the Scotch Education Department.

6. This Order shall commence to have effect on the third day of April, one thousand nine hundred and eleven.
