LERWICK HARBOUR EXTENSION. RATING POWERS, AND INCREASE OF TRUSTEES' BORROWING POWERS. &c.

(Power to erect new works; new works and works executed since 1877 to form part of the undertaking of the Lerwick Harbour Trustees; extension of the Borrowing Powers conferred upon the Lerwick Harbour Trustees by the Lerwick Harbour Improvements Act 1877, 40 and 41 Vict. Chap. exciv.; Powers to levy Tonnage Dues upon certain vessels loading, discharging or transhipping cargo, or carrying on the business of herring curing, within the Conservancy Limits of the Harbour of Lerwick, although not making any use of the Trustees' works; Revision of Shore Dues on Fresh and Roused Herrings; Alteration of time for Audit | undertaking as so defined.

of Trustees' Annual Accounts; Provision for voting by Ratepayers at election of Trustees being by Ballot; Alteration of Area within which Ratepayers or Shipowners must reside or have place of business in order to qualify as electors of Trustees; Amendment of the Lerwick Harbour Improvements Act 1877.)

OTICE is hereby given that an Application is intended to be made to the Secretary for Scotland by Petition under the provision of the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act 1899 for a Provisional Order promoted by the Trustees of the Port and Harbour of Lerwick incorporated under the Lerwick Harbour Improvements Act 1877 hereinafter called the Act of 1877, for the following objects, that is to say:—

1. To authorise the Trustees to construct the following works, viz. :-

I. A Pier commencing at the eastmost extremity of Hay's Pier at Lerwick, and thence extending in a north-easterly direction for a distance of one hundred and ten feet or thereby, and thence extending in a north-westerly direction for a distance of one hundred and eighty feet or thereby, and thence extending in a southwesterly direction for a distance of one hundred and twenty-six feet or thereby, and there terminating in the bed of the sea, which work will be solid throughout.

II. An extension of the existing Victoria Pier at Lerwick, commencing at the north-east or seaward end of that Pier and thence extending in a north-easterly direction for a distance of one hundred feet or thereby from the said point of commencement and there terminating in the bed of the sea, which work will be solid throughout.

III. A slip commencing at the south end of Albert Wharf at Lerwick and extending in a south-easterly direction for a distance of eighty feet or thereby and there terminating, which work will be solid throughout.

IV. The Reclamation of Ground, raising and making up of the ground or foreshore between the last mentioned work No. 3 and the roadway of North Esplanade, which work will be solid throughout.

V. A Widening of Victoria Pier at Lerwick by filling up the existing slip situated on the north side and inner end of said Pier, which work will be solid throughout.

Together with all necessary bulwarks, embankments, walls, quays, piers, jetties, wharves, roads, sheds, approaches, stairs, cranes, moorings, buoys, lights and other works at and connected there-

All the said works will be situated within the Parish of Lerwick and Gulberwick and County of

- 2. To authorise the Trustees to deviate laterally and vertically from the lines and levels of the works to be authorised by the Order, as shewn on the Plans and Sections herein after mentioned, to the extent shewn thereon or as may be prescribed by the Order.
- 3. To provide that all works executed by the Trustees since 1877 and the works to be authorised by the Order shall form part of the undertaking of the Trustees.
- 4. To entitle the Trustees to levy Rates in respect of the undertaking as defined by the Order, and to extend the Trustees' powers to the

5: To authorise the Trustees to charge tonnage dues upon all ships lying within the Conservancy Limits of the Harbour of Lerwick as defined in the Act of 1877, Section 35, and loading, discharging or transhipping cargo or carrying on the business of herring curing, otherwise than at the Trustees' works or at private wharves or piers, and to charge dues upon coal hulks lying within the Conservancy Limits, selling and discharging coal otherwise than at the Trustees' works or at private piers during the Fishing Season.

6. To authorise the Trustees to increase the Shore Dues on Fresh and Roused Herrings from

one penny to three pence per cran.

7. To authorise the Harbour Trustees to borrow a sum of £15,000 in addition to the sum of £20,000 which they are at present authorised to borrow on the security of the rates authorised to be levied by the Act of 1877 and by this Order and of their revenue and undertaking.

8. To provide that in place of the whole of the Trustees retiring annually, one Trustee from each of the four groups of Trustees, viz.:—Those elected by the Ratepayers, the County Council, the Shipowners, and the Corporation,—shall retire annually, and be eligible for re-election, and that each Trustee when elected shall be

elected for three years.

9. To provide procedure whereby a draft List of Ratepayers entitled to vote in the election of the Harbour Trustees may be prepared by the Clerk to the Trustees, and objections to the accuracy of said List may be presented to the Trustees or a Committee of the Trustees before the final List is made up and certified by the Clerk.

10. To provide that voting at elections of Trustees by the ratepayers shall be by ballot.

11. To provide that ratepayers and shipowners resident or carrying on business within the old Parish of Lerwick and Gulberwick shall be qualified as electors of Trustees.

12. To authorise the Trustees from time to time during the construction of the works to be

authorised by the Order, to shut up, whether wholly or partially, the Harbour and works connected therewith or any part or parts thereof.

13. To amend the Lerwick Harbour Improvements Act 1877.

14. To extend the time within which the Auditor must report on the Annual Accounts of the Trustees from 31st January to 28th February, and to provide for the appointment of an Auditor by the Sheriff in the event of the Auditor appointed in terms of Section 65 of the Act of 1877 resigning or dying or otherwise being incapacitated from performing his duties during the term of three years for which he had been elected in terms of said Section 65.

15. To incorporate with and to extend and make applicable to the purposes of the Order with or without modification, alteration or amendment all or some of the provisions of the Lands Clauses (Scotland) Acts, the Harbours and Piers Clauses Act 1847, the Commissioners Clauses Act 1847, and the Railways Clauses

Act 1867.

16. And notice is also further given that Duplicate Plans and Sections describing the lines and situations and levels of the several works hereinbefore described will, on or before the 31st day of March 1911 be deposited for public inspection in the Office at Lerwick of

the Principal Sheriff Clerk of the County of Zetland.

17. The petition for the Order and printed copies thereof, and of the draft Order, along with a copy of said Plans and Sections, will be lodged at the Office of the Secretary for Scotland, Whitehall, London, on the 17th day of April next and on the same day a printed copy of the Draft Order along with copies of said Plans and Sections will be deposited in the Office of the Clerk of the Parliaments, and in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons.

18. The subsequent procedure will be by way of Provisional Order (unless it is otherwise decided) in terms of the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act 1899, in which case the procedure may be by way of Private Bill, and this Notice and the deposits will, subject to the Standing Orders of Parliament, apply to such Bill.
