This day the Right Hon. Charles Lord Barmham was, by his Majesty's command, sworn of his Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and took his place at the Board accordingly.

**ST JAMES'S—MAY 1. 1805:**  
This day Monsieur de Rehaufen, Minister Plenipotentiary from the King of Sweden, had a private audience of his Majesty, to deliver his credentials; to which he was introduced by the Right Hon. Lord Mulgrave, his Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and conducted by Sir Stephen Cottrell, Knt. Master of the Ceremonies.

**MAY 2. 1805.**  
This day Monsieur de Rehaufen, Minister Plenipotentiary from the King of Sweden, had a private audience of her Majesty; to which he was introduced by the Earl of Morton, Lord Chamberlain to her Majesty, and conducted by the Master of the Ceremonies.
