Copy of a Letter from Captain Mitchell, of his Majesty's sloop Inspector, to Wm. Marsden, Esq. dated Yarmouth Roads, May 14. 1805.

SIR—I have to inform you, that his Majesty's sloop Mufquito has sent in this morning the French privateer Orestes, dogger-rigged, mounting one long 24-pounder and six swivels, and manned with 34 men.

WESTMINSTER, MAY 17. 1805.

This day, the Lords being met, and the Commons attending, the Royal Assent, by commission, was given to

An act for raising the sum of 1,500,000l. by way of annuities, for the service of Ireland.

An act to amend the laws for improving and keeping in repair the post roads in Ireland, and for rendering the conveyance of letters by his Majesty's Post Office more secure and expeditious.

An act to extend the provisions of an act, made in the last Session of Parliament, for preventing counterfeiting certain silver coin issued by the Banks of England and Ireland respectively, to silver pieces which may be issued by the Governor and Company of the Bank of Ireland, called Tokens, and to promote the circulation of the said tokens.

An act for confirming the charter, and enlarging the powers of the Incorporation of the Officers of Excise in Scotland.

An act for erecting and maintaining a harbour, docks, and other works at Androssan, in the county of Ayr.

An act for raising a further sum of money for the improvement of the harbour of Leith.

An act for altering, amending, and consolidating several acts for repairing turnpike roads in the county of Ayr, for repairing other roads therein, and for making more effectual the statute labour in the said county.

An act for continuing the term, and altering the powers of so much of two acts made in the 12th and 32d years of his present Majesty, as relate to the road from Ingliston Bridge, by Biggar, to Leadhills, and to the confines of the county of Lanark, and for making and maintaining a continuation of

the said road from Dolphinton to the confines of the county of Edinburgh.

And to 21 English road and private acts.
