NATIONAL INSURANCE ACT, 1911. (1 and 2 Geo. V., c. 55.)

NOTICE is hereby given, under the Rules
Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed
by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's
Treasury, after the expiration of at least forty days from this date, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by section 83 of the National Insurance Act, 1911, and of every other power enabling them on that behalf, to issue Regulations for the purpose of confirming and amending the provisional Treasury Regulations, dated the 28th ultimo, which provides for the constitution of a Joint Committee of the several bodies of Commissioners under Part I. of the Act, and for the purpose of making further provision for the exercise and performance by the Joint Committee of certain of the powers and duties of these bodies under that Part of the Act either alone or jointly with one or more of these bodies.
