#### FOREIGN OFFICE, April 22, 1912.

#### FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, pursuant to section 3 (3) of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that on the 19th April 1912 he made an Order under section 1 (4) of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, granting to parts of factories which are rooms in which lacemaking by machine is carried on a special exception from the provisions of the section in regard to limewashing.
