PRESENT,

The King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 15th day of July 1912, in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an officer, seaman, or marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

“And whereas, in order to meet the requirements of Your Majesty's Fleet, it is desirable that further provision should be made for the advancement of Warrant Officers and Petty Officers so as to enable them to attain the rank of Lieutenant at an earlier age than is possible under existing regulations :

“And whereas we are further of opinion that, in cases where Commissioned Warrant rank exists, such rank should be attained by all deserving Warrant Officers after not more than fifteen years' service as Warrant Officer, instead of after varying periods as at present :

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the following arrangements :—

(1) A selection to be made of Warrant Officers

and Petty Officers who are considered likely to prove suitable for commissioned rank, Petty Officers so selected being given the rank of Acting Warrant Officer and granted the usual Uniform allowance of £25.

(2) After undergoing such courses of instruction as may be laid down from time to time the selected candidates to be given the rank of Acting Mate, with pay, &c., as shown in the annexed schedule.

(3) After such further instruction as may be considered necessary and on passing a qualifying examination. Acting Mates to be confirmed as Mates and granted a Uniform allowance of £50.

(4) After serving at sea for such period and fulfilling such conditions as may be prescribed, Mates to be eligible for promotion to the rank of Lieutenant, and if so promoted to be granted a further gratuity of £50 for Uniform and outfit.

(5) On promotion, such Lieutenants to be governed in all respects by the regulations in force for the Lieutenants of Your Majesty's Fleet who have been entered as Cadets.

(6) All deserving Warrant Officers belonging to classes in which Commissioned Warrant rank is attainable to be advanced to Commissioned Warrant rank after 15 years' service as Warrant Officer as from the first day of April 1912, always provided that this regulation shall not be applicable to those classes of Warrant Officers who can attain Commissioned Warrant rank under existing regulations after less than 15 years' service until the normal period of service before promotion to Commissioned Warrant rank extends to 15 years, and further, that power be reserved to the Admiralty to advance Warrant Officers to Commissioned Warrant rank after less than 15 years for War

or distinguished service, Officers so advanced to remain supernumerary under the conditions laid down in Order in Council of the 29th February 1908.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

" SCHEDULE.

" PAY, &C., OF MATES.

(1) Pay on promotion to Acting Mate, 8s. a day, inclusive of any specialist allowance.

(2) Messing allowance, 2s. a day.

(3) *Pensions*.—Pension to be £50, if owing to any exceptional circumstances a Mate is not promoted to the rank of Lieutenant.

(4) *Number*.—The number of Mates not to exceed 100.

(5) In all other respects (extra pay, Lodging Provision and Subsistence Allowances, Widows' pensions and compassionate allowances for children) Mates to be subject to the regulations for Commissioned Warrant Officers."

His Majesty having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

"And whereas we consider it desirable to increase the pay of men entered for Combined Service in the Royal Navy and Royal Fleet Reserve under the provisions of Section 4 of the Naval Forces Act, 1903 :

"We therefore beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to provide that after such service in the Royal Navy as may be prescribed men entered under the provisions of the said Act may receive pay at the Continuous Service rates of their ratings while serving in the Royal Navy.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"And whereas it is desirable that similar provision should be made for the emoluments of the Officers and others serving in the naval wing of the said Corps :

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the following arrangements :—

"(1) Officers, Warrant Officers and men appointed to serve in the naval wing of the Royal Flying Corps to be graded and to receive pay as follows :—

Naval Wing . . . £800 per annum,
with quarters,
inclusive of all
allowances.

"(2) The rates of flying pay to be granted to Warrant Officers and men to be dependent upon their flying proficiency under such conditions as may be laid down.

"(3) An allowance of 5s. per day to be paid to the Secretary to the Commandant of the Central Flying School.

"(4) Officers, Warrant Officers and men under tuition at the Central Flying School to receive the pay of their rank or rating together with half the authorised rates of flying pay.

"(5) A sum of £75 to be paid to Officers who have obtained the certificate of the Royal Aero Club at their own expense, provided their selection for the Royal Flying Corps is approved.

"(6) Officers belonging to the First Reserve of the Royal Flying Corps to be paid :—

"(a) While fulfilling their proficiency obligation, the pay and allowances of their rank with flying pay for such number of days as may be found necessary, regard being had to weather conditions.

"(b) While performing duty with the Flying Corps, either for higher instruction or when called out for duty in peace or war, the Flying Corps pay of their grade, together with flying pay.

"(7) Warrant Officers and men of the Reserve of the Royal Flying Corps to receive annual retainers as follows :—

"(a) If performing quarterly tests, while on the Active List . . . £10
Others . . . £20

"(b) If not performing quarterly tests, while on the Active List . Nil
Others . . . £10

"(8) Officers injured on flying duty or when undergoing a course of instruction at the Central Flying School or the Naval Flying School, or privately with our permission, to be eligible for pensions and gratuities under the conditions laid down in the case of Officers wounded in action.

"(9) In the event of death occurring within seven years of such injury, pensions to be awarded to the Officer's widow and compassionate allowances to his children or other relatives under the conditions applicable to the case of Officers killed in action or dying of wounds received in action.

"(10) In the cases of men the conditions laid down in the event of their being killed in action or dying of wounds received in action or discharged for wounds received in action to be applicable, subject to the limit of two years being extended to seven years.

"(11) The service of Officers in the Royal Flying Corps, with the exception of service in the Reserve, to count as service in a ship of war at sea, from the date of the certificate of the Royal Aero Club being obtained.

"We would further submit that the rates of pay, pension, retainer or other emoluments set forth herein may take effect as from the first day of April 1912, and may be regarded as in force provisionally.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Education (Scotland) Act, 1908.

PROPOSED ORDER BY THE SCOTCH EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

SCHOOL BOARD OF DALKEITH (TOWN).

SCHOOL BOARD OF DALKEITH

(LANDWARD).

WHEREAS by subsection (1) of section 22 of the Education (Scotland) Act, 1908 (8 Edward 7, cap. 63), it is enacted that where it is represented to the Department by a School Board that it would be expedient that the district or part of a district of the said school board should be united with the adjacent district or part of district of another school board, so as for all purposes to constitute a district under one school board, the Department shall consult with the authorities concerned, and may cause a local inquiry to be held, and, if they are of opinion that the districts should be united, may by order provide for uniting the said districts as aforesaid :

And whereas it has been represented to the Department by the School Board of Dalkeith (Town) that it would be expedient that the district of the said School Board should be united with the adjacent district of the School Board of Dalkeith (Landward), so as for all purposes to constitute a district under one school board :

And whereas the Department, after consulting with the authorities concerned and causing a local inquiry to be held, are of opinion that the said districts should be united as aforesaid :

And whereas it is expedient that the said districts should be united as aforesaid :

Now therefore the Department, in virtue of the powers in that behalf conferred upon them by the enactment above recited, do hereby order as follows, *videlicet* :—

1. The district of the School Board of Dalkeith (Town) shall, from and after the date at which this Order shall commence to have effect, be united with the district of the School Board of Dalkeith (Landward) so as for all purposes to constitute a district under one School Board.

2. The existing School Boards shall cease to exist, and there shall be established in their room for the districts united as aforesaid one school board to be called "The School Board of Dalkeith."

3. The said School Board of Dalkeith (hereinafter referred to as "the School Board") shall consist of the twelve members who at the date hereof constitute the said existing school boards. The said members shall hold office until the school board election to be held in the year 1914 in terms of the Education (Scotland) Acts, 1872 to 1908, after which date the number of members of the School Board shall be nine.

4. The whole property, heritable and moveable, real and personal, including the respective school funds and any funds held in trust, belonging to the existing school boards, and all debts and obligations due to the existing school boards, shall be transferred to and vested in the School

Board in property or in trust as the case may be ; and save as hereinafter provided all teachers, janitors, officers, and other employees in the service of the existing school boards shall be transferred to, and become teachers, janitors, officers, and employees in the service of the School Board.

Provided always that the School Board shall not be bound to take over the Clerk to the School Board of Dalkeith (Landward), but such officer shall receive from the School Board a gratuity of thirty-five pounds as compensation for abolition of office.

5. The whole debts and liabilities of the existing school boards shall be taken over by, and become debts and liabilities of, the School Board.

6. With respect to the deficiency in the School Fund of the School Board and the sum required to meet the same, the following provisions shall have effect, *videlicet* :—

(a) The deficiency in the school fund shall be allocated upon the district of the School Board, so that for the financial year from Whitsunday 1912 to Whitsunday 1913 the school rate to be levied in the existing district of the School Board of Dalkeith (Landward) shall exceed the school rate levied in the said district for the financial year from Whitsunday 1911 to Whitsunday 1912 by twopence in the pound, and thereafter in each succeeding financial year shall exceed the school rate levied in the said district in the preceding financial year by twopence in the pound, or, in the event of the difference being less than twopence by such smaller sum per pound as may bring the said rate per pound up to an equality with the school rate per pound levied in the existing district of the School Board of Dalkeith (Town).

(b) When the school rate per pound levied in the existing district of the School Board of Dalkeith (Landward) has been brought up as aforesaid to an equality with the school rate per pound levied in the existing district of the School Board of Dalkeith (Town) and in any event from and after the sixteenth day of May, 1917, the deficiency in the School Fund of the School Board of Dalkeith shall thenceforth be met by a uniform rate levied in the district of the said School Board.

(c) For the purposes of this Order the school rate per pound shall be calculated in the manner prescribed by section 25 of the Education (Scotland) Act, 1908.

7. The whole expenses of the proceedings in connection with this Order shall be defrayed out of the school fund of the School Board.

8. In this Order the expression "the Department" means the Scotch Education Department.

9. Notwithstanding the date hereof, this Order shall be deemed to have taken effect for the purposes of section 6 as at the sixteenth day of May one thousand nine hundred and twelve : and, *quoad ultra*, this Order shall commence to have effect on the thirtieth day of September in the same year.
