Greeting!

Whereas We have deemed it expedient that a Commission should forthwith issue to examine and report upon the following matters in connection with the Indian Civil Service, and other civil services, Imperial and Provincial:—

(1) The methods of recruitment and the systems of training and probation;

(2) The conditions of service, salary, leave, and pension;

(3) Such limitations as still exist in the employment of non-Europeans and the working of the existing system of division of services into Imperial and Provincial;

and generally to consider the requirements of the Public Service, and to recommend such changes as may seem expedient:

Now know ye that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your knowledge and ability, have authorised and appointed, and do by these Presents authorise and appoint you the said John Poynder, Baron Islington (Chairman); Lawrence John Lumley Dundas (commonly called Earl of Ronaldshay); Sir Murray Hammick; Sir Theodore Morison; Sir Valentine Chirol; Mahadev Bhaskar Chaula; Abdur Rahim; Gopal Krishna Gokhale; Walter Culley Madge; Frank George

Sly; Herbert Albert Laurens Fishea; and James Ramsay Macdonald to be Our Commissioners for the purposes of the said inquiry.

And for the better effecting the purposes of this Our Commission, We do by these Presents give and grant unto you, or any three or more of you, full power, at any place in Our said United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or in India, to call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this Our Commission; and also, whether in Our said United Kingdom, or in India, to call for, have access to, and examine all such books, documents, registers, and records as may afford you the fullest information on the subject, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever.

And We do by these Presents authorise and empower you, or any three or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid.

And We do by these Presents will and ordain that this, Our Commission, shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

And We do further ordain that you, or any three or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time if you shall judge it expedient so to do.

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any three or more of you, your opinion upon the matters herein submitted for your consideration.

HOUSING, TOWN PLANNING, &c., ACT,
1909.

(9 Edward VII., Chapter 44).

FURTHER ORDER OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD FOR SCOTLAND, fixing the date after which a person shall not be entitled to obtain compensation under section 58 of the above-cited Act, in connexion with the proposed application of the Suburban District Committee of the Midlothian County Council as Local Authority for the said District, for authority to prepare a Town Planning Scheme.

WHEREAS by subsection (1) of section 58 of the Housing, Town Planning, &c., Act, 1909, provision is made for compensation in respect of property injuriously affected by a Town Planning Scheme:

AND WHEREAS, by subsection (2) of section 58 of the said Act, it is provided that: "A person shall not be entitled to obtain compensation under this section on account of any building erected on, or contract made or other thing done with respect to, land included in a scheme, after the time at which the application for authority to prepare the scheme was made, or after such other time as the Local Government Board may fix for the purpose":

AND WHEREAS, by Our Order, dated the twenty-first day of August one thousand nine hundred and twelve, in response to an application by the Suburban District Committee of the Midlothian County Council, We, the Local Government Board for Scotland, fixed the sixth day of July of this year as the date after which a person shall not be entitled to compensation under the aforesaid section:

AND WHEREAS We further prescribed that the said Order shall cease to have effect unless the application to Us for authority to prepare a Town Planning Scheme shall be made not later than one month after the sixth day of September of this year, or such later date as We, by a further Order, might fix:

AND WHEREAS the said Local Authority have applied to Us to make a further Order fixing the sixth day of November next as the date by which formal application to Us shall be made:

NOW THEREFORE We, the Local Government Board for Scotland, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, by this Our further Order hereby amend Our Order, dated the twenty-first day of August one thousand nine hundred and twelve, to the extent that We now hereby prescribe that the said Order shall cease to have effect unless the application to Us shall be made not later than the sixth day of November next, or such later date as We, by a further Order, may fix.

Education (Scotland) Act, 1908.

PROPOSED ORDER BY THE SCOTCH EDUCATION
DEPARTMENT.

SCHOOL BOARD OF KILSYTH (TOWN).
SCHOOL BOARD OF KILSYTH
(LANDWARD).

WHEREAS by subsection (1) of section 22 of the Education (Scotland) Act, 1908 (8 Edward 7, cap. 63), it is enacted that where it is represented to the Department by a School Board that it would be expedient that the district or part of a district of the said school board should be united with the adjacent district or part of district of another school board, so as for all purposes to constitute a district under one school board, the Department shall consult with the authorities concerned,

and may cause a local inquiry to be held, and, if they are of opinion that the districts should be united, may by order provide for uniting the said districts as aforesaid :

And whereas it has been represented to the Department by the School Board of Kilsyth (Town) that it would be expedient that the district of the said School Board should be united with the adjacent district of the School Board of the Parish of Kilsyth (Landward), so as for all purposes to constitute a district under one school board :

And whereas the Department, after consulting with the authorities concerned and causing a local inquiry to be held, are of opinion that the said districts should be united as aforesaid :

And whereas it is expedient that the said districts should be united as aforesaid :

Now therefore the Department, in virtue of the powers in that behalf conferred upon them by the enactment above recited, do hereby order as follows, *videlicet* :—

1. The district of the School Board of Kilsyth (Town) shall, from and after the date at which this Order shall commence to have effect, be united with the district of the School Board of the Parish of Kilsyth (Landward) so as for all purposes to constitute a district under one school board.

2. The existing School Boards shall cease to exist, and there shall be established in their room for the districts united as aforesaid one school board to be called "The School Board of Kilsyth."

3. The said School Board of Kilsyth (hereinafter referred to as "the School Board") shall consist of the twelve members who at the date of the commencement of this Order constitute the said existing school boards. The said members shall hold office until the school board election to be held in the year 1914 in terms of the Education (Scotland) Acts, 1872 to 1908, after which date the number of members of the School Board shall be nine.

4. The whole property, heritable and moveable, real and personal, including the respective school funds and any funds held in trust, belonging to the existing school boards, and all debts and obligations due to the existing school boards, shall be transferred to and vested in the School Board in property or in trust as the case may be ; and all teachers, janitors, officers, and other employees in the service of the existing school boards shall be transferred to, and become teachers, janitors, officers, and employees in the service of the School Board.

5. The whole debts and liabilities of the existing school boards shall be taken over by, and become debts and liabilities of, the School Board.

6. With respect to the deficiency in the School Fund of the School Board and the sum required to meet the same, the following provisions shall have effect, *videlicet* :—

(a) The deficiency in the School Fund shall, except as hereinafter provided, be allocated upon the districts of the existing school boards so that the school rate to be levied in the district of the School Board of the Parish of Kilsyth (Landward) for a period of three years commencing with the sixteenth day of May 1913, shall be as follows, namely :—

For the year from Whitsunday 1913 to Whitsunday, 1914, 11d. per pound.

For the year from Whitsunday 1914 to Whitsunday 1915, 1s. 1d. per pound.

For the year from Whitsunday 1915 to Whitsunday 1916, 1s. 3d. per pound.

Provided that these rates do not exceed in each year the school rate per pound to be levied in the district of the School Board of Kilsyth (Town) for that year.

Provided also that the school rate to be levied, as aforesaid, for the year from Whitsunday 1913 to Whitsunday 1914 shall be increased by such amount as may be required to meet the whole of the expenses incurred by the School Board of the Parish of Kilsyth (Landward) in connection with their appearance at the said local inquiry.

(b) For the financial year from Whitsunday 1916 to Whitsunday 1917 and thenceforward, the deficiency in the School Fund of the School Board shall be met by a uniform rate levied in the district of the said School Board.

(c) For the purposes of this Order, the school rate per pound shall be calculated in the manner prescribed by section 25 of the Education (Scotland) Act, 1908.

7. The expenses of the local inquiry held as aforesaid shall, save as hereinbefore provided, be defrayed out of the School Fund of the School Board.

8. In this Order the expression "The Department" means the Scotch Education Department.

9. This Order shall commence to have effect on the eleventh day of November one thousand nine hundred and twelve.
