The following is an account of the services in respect of which the Decoration has been conferred:—

While James Edward Morgan was bathing at Lane Cove, Sydney, New South Wales, on the 26th of January 1912, he was attacked by a shark when some distance from the shore.

In response to his cries for help, Alfred Barlow and William D. M'Kay, who were in the water, went to his assistance, and succeeded in bringing him to land. While they were actually engaged in doing so, the shark made a second attack on Morgan, and inflicted injuries to which he succumbed.

The rescuers were fully aware of their danger, and incurred very considerable risk in rendering their services.

THE MOTOR CARS REGULATION (COUNTY OF PERTH) ORDER, 1912, dated 7th September 1912.

In pursuance of the powers vested in me by section 9, as read with section 18 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, I, the Right Honourable Thomas M'Kinnon Wood, His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, on the application of the County Council of the County of Perth, being the local authority of the said County, do hereby make the following regulations:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Motor Cars Regulation (County of Perth) Order, 1912," and the regulations hereby prescribed shall take effect within the limits or places referred to therein on and after the respective dates at which, for the purpose of giving effect thereto, the local authority shall, in terms of section 10 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, place notices in conspicuous places on or near such limits or places.
2. A person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour within the limits or places specified in the schedule to this Order.
3. Upon the preceding regulation taking effect, the regulations prescribed by the Motor Cars Regulation (County of Perth) (No. 1) Order, 1907, shall cease to have effect as regards such portions of the highways or parts of highways specified in the Schedule thereto as is included in the limits or places specified in the Schedule to this Order.

* Section 8 of the Corn Returns Act, 1882, provides that where returns of purchases of British Corn are made to the Local Inspector of Corn Returns in any other measure than the imperial bushel or by weight or by a weighed measure, that Officer shall convert such returns into the imperial bushel, and in the case of weight or weighed measure the conversion is to be made at the rate of sixty imperial pounds for every bushel of wheat, fifty imperial pounds for every bushel of barley, and thirty-nine imperial pounds for every bushel of oats.
