EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1875.

NOTICE is hereby given that, after the expiration of forty days from the date hereof, it is proposed to submit to His Majesty in Council, in pursuance of the above-mentioned Act, the draft of an Order in Council amending General Rule No. 3 of Part I. of the Order in Council of the 26th October 1896 (Order No. 16) relating to the keeping of Mixed Explosives on Registered Premises.

And notice is hereby further given that, in accordance with the provisions of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, copies of the proposed draft Order in Council can be obtained by any public body, within forty days of the date of this notice, at the Privy Council Office, Whitehall.

THE MOTOR CARS REGULATION (COUNTY OF INVERNESS) ORDER, 1912, dated 16th September 1912.

In pursuance of the powers vested in me by section 9, as read with section 18 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, I, the Right Honourable Thomas M'Kinnon Wood, His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, on the application of the County Council of the County of Inverness, being the local authority of the said County, do hereby make the following regulations:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Motor Cars Regulation (County of Inverness) Order, 1912," and the regulations hereby prescribed shall take effect within the limits or places referred to therein on and after the respective dates at which, for the purpose of giving effect thereto, the local authority shall, in terms of section 10 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, place notices in conspicuous places on or near such limits or places.
2. A person shall not drive a motor car at
