### ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND), AMENDMENT ORDER OF 1912 (No. 10).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :—

1. The Animals (Landing from Ireland) Amendment Order of 1912 (No. 9) shall be read and have effect as if Drogheda and Dundalk were included in the First Schedule thereto (*Ports from which animals may be brought for immediate slaughter only*).

2. This Order shall come into operation on the second day of October nineteen hundred and twelve.

3. This Order may be cited as the ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND) AMENDMENT ORDER OF 1912 (No. 10).
