CROWN OFFICE, October 1, 1912.

THE King has been pleased, by Letters Patent under the Great Seal, and dated the 1st day of October 1912, to appoint the Right Honourable Sir John Fletcher Moulton, Knight, a Lord Justice of Appeal, to be a Lord of Appeal in Ordinary under the provisions of "The Appellate Jurisdiction Act, 1876," and to grant to him the dignity of a Baron for life by the style and title of Baron Moulton of Bank, in the County of Southampton.
