**W**HEREAS the Secretary for Scotland has, under the provisions of the Burial Grounds (Scotland) Act, 1855, made a Representation that he has received a copy of an Interlocutor of the Sheriff-Substitute of the County of Perth at Perth, dated the 9th May 1912, and made on a Petition of the Reverend J. Caithness Ingles and others, being persons assessed for the relief of the poor in the Parish of Crieff, in the County of Perth, or householders residing within 100 yards of the United Free Church Burial Ground, Crieff, finding that the said United Free Church Burial Ground, Crieff, is in a condition offensive to health and contrary to decency :

And whereas in the said Representation it is recommended that the said Burial Ground should be closed in terms of the said Act as a place of sepulture, subject to reservation of the right of interment in the said Burial Ground, at decease, of Margaret Morris, of Galvelmore Street, Crieff. Provided always as regards all interments in the said Burial Ground after the date of the closing Order that the following conditions be observed : (1) that the exercise of the right of burial shall not be injurious to the public health or offensive or contrary to decency, (2) that notice shall be given to the Clerk to the Parish Council of Crieff on the day preceding that on which a grave is to be opened, (3) that
