The King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS by an Order in Council dated the 26th day of October, 1896, the maximum quantity of mixed explosives which may be kept on registered premises is ordered and prescribed.

And whereas, in the opinion of His Majesty, this quantity may in certain circumstances be increased with due regard to public safety.

And whereas the provisions of section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with :

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order and prescribe as follows :—

The maximum quantity of explosive allowed to be kept on premises registered for the keeping of mixed explosives shall be the following :—

(1) If the only explosive kept be one or more of the following :—

- (a) Gunpowder ;
- (b) Small-arm nitro-compound ;
- (c) Ammunition of the 1st Division of Class 6 ; the maximum shall be :

In Mode A.	lbs.
Gunpowder and small-arm nitro-compound, in all ... ..	200
And, in addition, of explosive contained in ammunition of the 1st Division of Class 6 ... ..	500

In Mode B.	lbs.
Gunpowder ... ..	50
or in lieu of each pound of gunpowder not so kept, two pounds of small-arm nitro-compound.	
And, in addition, of explosive contained in ammunition of the 1st Division of Class 6 ... ..	500

(2) If the only explosive kept be one or more of the following :—

- (a) Fireworks ;
- (b) Ammunition of the 1st Division of Class 6 ; the maximum shall be :

In Mode A.	lbs.
Fireworks ... ..	200*
And, in addition, of explosive contained in ammunition of the 1st Division of Class 6 ... ..	500

In Mode B.		lbs.
Fireworks ... ..	...	50*
And, in addition, of explosive con- tained in ammunition of the 1st Division of Class 6 ... ..	...	500

(3) In any other case the maximum shall be :

In Mode A.		lbs.
Mixed explosives (including gun- powder) ... ..	...	60
And, in addition, of explosive con- tained in ammunition of the 1st Division of Class 6 ... ..	...	500

Mixed explosives (including gun- powder) ... ..	...	15

(4) Provided that in each of the three cases above mentioned the aggregate amount kept on the premises in Mode A and Mode B together may not in any case exceed the maximum amount which may be kept in Mode A.

And General Rule No. 3 of Part I. of the said Order in Council of the 26th October 1896 (No. 16), shall be deemed to be amended accordingly.

WHITEHALL, December 11, 1912.

His Majesty the King has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal of the Second Class to Henry Saunders and Alexander Griffiths under the following circumstances:—

On the 30th September, 1912, Thomas Richards and a man named Jones were repairing an air road by taking down a low portion of the roof, known to miners as a bridge. The bridge was about 10 feet long and nearly 12 feet thick, and at one end of it the road below was nearly blocked by fallen *débris*. In order to do his work, Richards made a small hole in the *débris*, and went through it; but, as he was returning, a piece fell and pinned his feet in the hole. His mate sent for the overman, Henry Saunders. Alexander Griffiths followed, and others were soon on the spot. Griffiths and Saunders went under the bridge and tried to take away the stone that was holding Richards; but a further fall of about 5 tramloads of *débris* completely buried him, and Griffiths and Saunders narrowly escaped the fall. Notwithstanding this indication of danger, the two men bravely went again under the bridge, working one behind the other in the small space available. Before they could get Richards out, signs of further movement of stone warned them to retreat, and the whole bridge, weighing about 20 tons, fell in. All present then started to work down through the fall to Richards, who was nine feet away, and eventually they got him out alive.

WHITEHALL, December 11, 1912.

His Majesty the King has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal of the Second Class to Walter Charles Simmons under the following circumstances:—

On the afternoon of Tuesday, 20th August, 1912, as an express passenger train was entering Bournemouth Station, a woman jumped from the platform in front of the engine. The driver promptly applied the brakes and sounded the whistle; but was unable to stop the train until the engine had passed the spot where the woman jumped down. Simmons' attention was attracted by the whistle when the engine was only about 12 yards away, and, without an instant's hesitation, he jumped off the platform on to the permanent way, and succeeded in lifting the woman clear off the rails and holding her against another train, which was stationary on an adjoining line, neither of them sustaining injury. There is no doubt whatever that the rescue was effected by Simmons at the risk of his life, and any delay or hesitation would, in all probability, have resulted in fatal consequences.

WHITEHALL, December 11, 1912.

His Majesty the King has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal of the First Class to Harry Parsons and the Edward Medal of the Second Class to Ernest Cannell, Thomas Evans, and John Robinson, also to allow the Edward Medal of the Second Class to be presented to the widows of William Ackred and George Bagnall under the following circumstances:—

On the 4th August, 1912, a gas flue, which is a thousand yards long and 6 feet in diameter, was in process of cleaning at the Barrow Hematite Steel Company's works, when a workman engaged in the operation entered the tube contrary to orders to recover a broken rake. He was immediately overcome by the gas, as were also two fellow-workmen, William Ackred and George Bagnall, who went to his assistance. Harry Parsons twice entered the flue at great risk to his life, and, with the help of Ernest Cannell, Thomas Evans, and John Robinson, succeeded in bringing out the three men, who had been overcome and who all unhappily lost their lives.

WHITEHALL, December 14, 1912.

The King has been pleased to give and grant unto Elena Josephine Emily, wife of Horace Prudentius Parodi, Esq., of Gibraltar, His Majesty's Royal licence and authority to accept and wear the Cross of the First Class of the Order of Naval Merit, which Decoration has been conferred upon her by His Majesty the King of Spain, in recognition of valuable services rendered by her to the sick and wounded of the Spanish Naval forces in the Melilla campaign.

WHITEHALL, December 14, 1912.

The King has been pleased to give and grant unto John Elder, Esq., Chief Engineer in the

Municipality of Damanhour, His Majesty's Royal licence and authority to accept and wear the Insignia of the Fourth Class of the Imperial Ottoman Order of the Medjidieh, which Decoration has been conferred upon him by His Highness the Khedive of Egypt, authorised by His Imperial Majesty the Sultan of Turkey, in recognition of valuable services rendered by him.

DOWNING STREET, December 14, 1912.

The King has been pleased to approve of the reappointment of Tan Jiak Kim, Esq., C.M.G., to be an Unofficial Member of the Legislative Council of the Straits Settlements.

DOWNING STREET, December 16, 1912.

The King has been pleased to give directions for the appointment of John Henry Brown, Esq., and Alexander Campbell Nicholson M'Hattie, Esq., M.B. (Chief Medical Officer), to be Members of the Legislative Council of the Bahama Islands.

THE MOTOR CARS REGULATION (BURGH OF LERWICK) (No. 1) ORDER, 1912, dated 19th December 1912, prohibiting and restricting Motor Car Traffic on certain Highways in the Burgh of Lerwick.

Whereas by Section 8, as read with Section 18 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is provided that the Secretary for Scotland may, in Scotland, by regulations made under section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Acts, 1896, prohibit or restrict the driving of any motor cars, or of any special kind of motor cars, on any specified highway, or part of a highway, which does not exceed sixteen feet in width, or on which ordinary motor car traffic would, in his opinion, be especially dangerous:

And whereas by Section 10, as read with Section 18 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is provided that local authorities within the meaning of Section 9 of the said Act shall give public notice of any regulation of the Secretary for Scotland made in pursuance of the said Act, prohibiting or restricting the use of motor cars on any highway, or part of a highway, or limiting the speed of motor cars within any limits or place, and for the purpose of giving effect to any such regulation shall place notices in conspicuous places on or near the highway, part of a highway, limits or place, to which the regulation refers:

And whereas the Town Council of the Burgh of Lerwick, being the local authority of the said Burgh, have applied to me to make regulations under the said Acts, and I am of opinion that in view of the geographical position of the said burgh and the steepness and narrowness of certain of the streets and lanes therein, it is expedient to

give effect to the said application to the extent hereinafter mentioned:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers vested in me in that behalf, I, the Right Honourable Thomas M'Kinnon Wood, His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, do hereby make the following Regulations under Section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896, as read with Section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Motor Cars Regulation (Burgh of Lerwick) (No. 1) Order, 1912," and the Regulations hereby prescribed shall take effect on the highways or parts of highways specified therein on and after the respective dates at which for the purpose of giving effect thereto the local authority shall place notices in conspicuous places on or near such highways or parts of highways.
2. No person shall cause or permit a motor car to be driven, or shall drive a motor car on any highway named in Schedule A to this Order.
3. No person shall cause or permit a motor car to be driven or shall drive a motor car at a speed exceeding six miles per hour on such part of the highway named in the first column of Schedule B to this Order as is defined in the second column of the said Schedule.

THE MOTOR CARS REGULATION (BURGH OF LERWICK) (No. 2) ORDER, 1912, dated 19th December 1912.

In pursuance of the powers vested in me by Section 9, as read with Section 18 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, I, the Right Honourable Thomas M'Kinnon Wood, His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, on the application of the Town

Council of the Burgh of Lerwick, being the local authority of the said Burgh, do hereby make the following regulations:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Motor Cars Regulation (Burgh of Lerwick) (No. 2) Order, 1912," and the regulations hereby prescribed shall take effect within the limits or places referred to therein on and after the respective dates at which, for the purpose of giving effect thereto, the local authority shall, in terms of Section 10 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, place notices in conspicuous places on or near such limits or places.
2. A person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour within the limits or places specified in the Schedule to this Order.

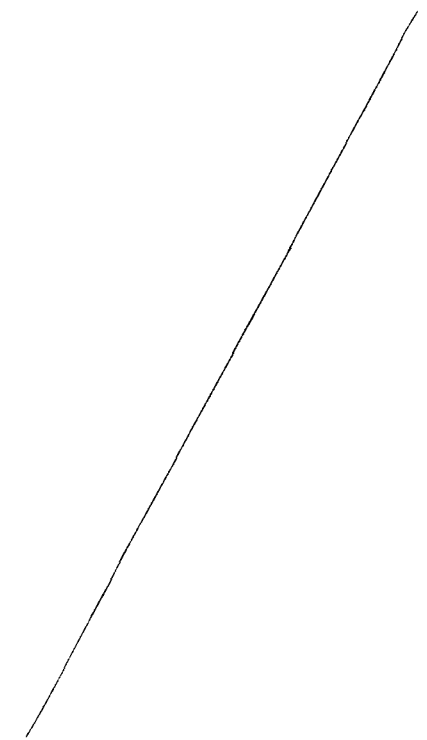
