ALTERATION OF PARISH AREAS.

FINAL ORDER NO. XLVIII.

(Dunder Combination Parish and Parish of Mains and Strathmartine.)

WHEREAS it has been represented to me by the Dundee Combination Parish Council that I should issue an Order under Section 51 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1889 and Section 46 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1894, annexing to the Dundee Combination Parish those portions of the Parish of Mains and Strathmartine which by the Dundee Extension and Improvement Act 1892 and the Dundee Corporation Order Confirmation Act 1907, were respectively annexed to the City and Royal Burgh of Dundee; and whereas, after consulting with the authorities concerned and causing a local enquiry to be held, I am of opinion that it is expedient to give effect to the said representation; and whereas I caused the proposed Order to be published in the Edinburgh Gazette of 7th January 1913:

Now THEREFORE I, the Right Honourable Thomas M'Kinnon Wood, His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, do, in virtue of the powers conferred upon me by the Local Government (Scotland) Acts, order as follows:—

- (1) The portions of the said Parish of Mains and Strathmartine above described (hereinafter referred to as the transferred area) shall cease to form part of the Parish of Mains and Strathmartine and shall form part of the Dundee Combination Parish.
- (2) The Dundee Combination Parish Council shall assume responsibility for, and shall relieve the Parish Council of Mains and Strathmartine of all advances which the latter body may be called upon to make for, or on account of, any pauper whose claim is derived (1) from birth in the transferred area prior to the fifteenth day of May 1913, or (2) from residence for the statutory period in the transferred area prior to the fifteenth day of May 1913.
- (3) Nothing herein contained shall affect the rights of creditors or of persons having vested interests; and all questions of adjustment consequent on the alterations of boundaries hereby made are expressly reserved.
- (4) The amount per pound of Poor Rate, School Rate and any other rate levied by the Parish Council of Dundee Combination Parish, within the transferred area in virtue of the provisions of this Order shall not during seven years from the commencement of this Order exceed the rate per pound of the corresponding rate levied in the said area by the Parish Council of Mains and Strathmartine in respect of the year ending 15th May 1913.
- (5) This Order shall take effect as from the fifteenth day of May, 1913.
